Consult with faculty advisor regarding School of Education admission requirements and for courses taken after admission to program. The School of Education (SOE) at UAFS requires twelve hours of math courses beyond College Algebra prior to admission into the Elementary Education program. Students who transfer to UAFS with the earned AAT and who successfully complete the Elementary Mathematics Subtest (details found here <a href="https://www.ets.org/praxis/ar/requirements/">https://www.ets.org/praxis/ar/requirements/</a> ) will not be required to take the additional math courses in order to be admitted into the program. Students must still complete 120 hours in order to graduate with the BS in Elementary Education.
