National Park College (NPC) students interested in earning a Bachelor of Science in Organizational Leadership (BSOL) degree from the University of Arkansas – Fort Smith (UAFS) may complete the first two years (lower division coursework) of the degree requirements at NPC by completing an Associate of Arts in programs approved by NPC. Completed NPC courses will be accepted by UAFS and applied to the BSOL degree requirements according to the UAFS Undergraduate Academic Catalog. UAFS will offer the remaining BSOL requirements through online courses. Per the partnership agreement, UAFS can transfer a maximum of 75 hours of lower division coursework for the BSOL.
