Executive Administrative Duties and Accomplishments

Fiscal Responsibility and Oversight:

- Currently provide leadership for the following Academic Administrative units in Academic Affairs:
 - **Academic Space Utilization** – *this unit is responsible for managing all academic space on our multiple campus locations and reporting to the Coordinating Board for the State of Texas. Coordinates academic scheduling of classroom and lab spaces in conjunction with the Registrar and academic departments.*
 - **Institutional Analytics, Effectiveness, and Accreditation (IAEA)** – *this unit provides all academic data and data analysis for the university and campus stakeholders. We are currently refining our “just in time” data portfolios (Departmental Profiles) for deans, departments heads, and other academic leaders to assist with operational efficiencies, program planning, fundraising, annual reporting, and accreditation/compliance efforts.*
 - **Registrar** – *this unit provides all services traditionally associated with a university Registrar (Banner System management, catalog and course integration, registration/drop/add support, academic calendar planning, Degree Works scribing, etc.) as well as required Coordinating Board reporting for the State of Texas.*
 - **Strategic Academic Initiatives (SAI)** – *this newly created unit, led by an Assistant Vice president, is responsible for pursuing external funding for academic initiatives, incubating said initiatives, and providing a structure for these initiatives before embedding them within offices in the Division of Academic Affairs. Two recent examples handed off to others within the division have been our First Year Experience program (ACE Communities) and our latest QEP for SACSCOC – Texan Smart.*
 - **Academic and Administrative Assessment** – *this unit coordinates official*

assessment efforts for campus-wide administrative units as well as required academic assessment. Provides training on the use of WEAVE as well as best practices associated with university assessment.

- **Administrative Fellowships** – *this newly created unit offers up to two faculty per academic year the opportunity to engage in an administrative fellowship focusing on developing general leadership skills, understanding university and division operations, assisting with special projects within the Division of Academic Affairs.*
- Previously provided leadership for Academic Administrative units in Academic Affairs as an AVP prior to our recent post-pandemic reorganization and addition of a third Associate Vice President; these units included the following:

Current Administrative Functions:

- Serve as the Academic Affairs representative on our COVID-19 taskforce;
 - Manage COVID-19 operations and communications for Academic Affairs;
- Serve as the Academic Affairs liaison with University Athletics;
- Serve as the SACSCOC university liaison and oversee the university's multiple SACSCOC budgets and reaffirmation/continuous compliance efforts;
- Serve as the Academic Affairs liaison for construction planning with the Assistant Vice President for Campus Operations;
- Provide leadership, support, and professional development for deans and department heads, including the creation of growth plans for administrators, faculty, and staff.
- Serve as one of the division's chief review officers for faculty/staff and student grievances and as a System trained designated division authority for civil rights, sexual harassment, and other egregious offences;
- Oversee adjunct and overload faculty budgeting for six academic colleges;
- Oversee summer instructional budgeting for six academic colleges; and
- Oversee the AA Scholarly Development program budgeting for all early career faculty.

Recent Administrative Accomplishments:

- Built and implemented a summer funding model for instruction based on semester credit hour production to incentivize college growth and strategic scheduling;
- Standardized faculty workload percentages with the division to ensure compliance with Tarleton's Faculty Workload SAP and accurate reporting to the THECB;

- Reviewed, updated, and implemented adjunct faculty workload policies to ensure effective use of adjunct faculty in college operations;
- Worked with IAEA to develop a “Departmental Profile” project that allows college leaders and the provost’s team to evaluate the effectiveness of college operations on a yearly basis and provide robust data for college leaders to utilize when budgeting, building schedules, requesting positions, and considering new programs of study;
- Led Tarleton State University through the SACSCOC reaffirmation process in April of 2021 with zero findings related to any SACSCOC standards and one suggestion to slightly narrow the focus of our QEP; the updated QEP was submitted in September 2021 and has been both funded and implemented;
- Implemented fiscal responsibility policies and procedures to reduce waste and increase capital reserves year over year in both my former college as dean and within the division as Associate Provost;
- While serving as dean,
 - led and provided oversight for a Child Development Center, three academic departments, one non-academic support department, and the School of Kinesiology, which includes two academic departments -
 - Salary - approximately \$5.2 million in salary plus benefits (100+ fac. and staff)
 - Operating – approximately \$400,000
 - Grants – approximately \$225,000
 - Created a travel policy to reduce financial waste and increase the use of affordable travel options and alternatives to address the need to constantly connect with multiple locations;
 - Standardized per/faculty travel and professional development amounts by department to ensure equity across the college’s departments, currently the only college on campus to do this;
 - Realized \$25,000 to \$45,000 in capital reserves year over year while serving as dean, resulting in COE reserves of over \$125,000 upon departure; and
 - Realized over \$500,000 in capital investments from Academic Affairs to support iPads in the classroom, cardiac rehabilitation, preparation for edTPA, eye-tracking research equipment, improvements for the Child Development Center, and equipment for educational diagnosticians.

Advancement Initiatives:

- Attended multiple Council for Advancement and Support of Education (CASE) workshops and classes;
- Mentoring deans and department heads concerning the development of advancement initiatives for both small and large gifts in relation to the university’s larger capital campaign;
- Working with the Provost to develop the Academic Circle for unrestricted giving;
- Working with colleague AVPs to implement an advancement plan for Study Abroad and Applied Learning Experiences (ALE) scholarships;
- As dean, created a new initiative to raise \$500,000 for the College of Education over a five-year period by targeting small annual gifts

- Launched a College of Education Advancement Campaign: (***Education Revolution!***);
- Increased college giving 150% from 2017 to 2018 (\$165,000);
- Implemented aggressive social media campaigns for Day of Giving and Giving Tuesday;
- Increased capital funding for College of Education projects; and
- Improved the college’s Crystal Apple Society program, from approximately \$5,000 per year to \$15,000 per year, yielding scholarship dollars for COE students
 - Endowed a Crystal Apple Society scholarship for students in the college.

Current Innovative Practices:

- Created the Academic Administrative Fellows program which is currently in its first year of implementation with one advanced fellow; this fellow and I are focusing on the development of department heads as well as working with our First Year Experience program;
- Managing an automated approval process for student travel within the division;
- Reorganized units within Academic Affairs to create an office of Strategic Academic Initiatives, focusing on securing external funding for innovative initiatives and practices across the division;
- Serve on the University’s Strategic Planning Council for our next ten-year strategic plan;
- Initiating an on-demand structure for Institutional Assessment, Effectiveness, and Accreditation to respond immediately to campus leaders’ needs;
- Working with university and divisional leaders to develop updated budgeting strategies; and
- Working with staff across campus to ensure continual compliance for SACSCOC and to provide specialty accreditation assistance to departments and programs.

Previous Innovative Practices:

- Worked with IAEA to develop a departmental proficiency and complexity matrix to provide colleges with data concerning faculty teaching, research, and service;
- Developed a monitoring system for Low Performing Programs as defined by the State of Texas as well as programs to “watch” as defined internally;
- Implemented study abroad policies to increase student, faculty, and community member participation;
- Instituted a Dean’s Innovation Grant Program -
 - Competitive grant program within the college rewarding selected innovative projects tied to recruitment, retention, student support, and/or research;
 - Over \$50,000 in grants awarded for year one, projects include flexible seating for a study on class environments, health and human performance research equipment, Quality Matters training for online programs, the creation of an innovative green screen enable space, and the creation of a Center for Child Wellbeing;
- Reorganized departments within the College of Education to include Curriculum and Instruction, Educational Leadership and Technology, Educator Preparation Services, and Psychological Sciences

- Appointed new leaders in each department within the past seven years;
- Added educational technology to the leadership program;
- Removed Educator Preparation Services from Curriculum and Instruction and created a standalone non-academic department to reinforce the idea that teacher education impacts departments and majors elsewhere on campus;
- Created the School of Kinesiology with two academic departments serving approximately 1,300 majors
 - Department of Health and Human Performance with three research laboratories and institutes;
 - Department of Sport Science with one proposed research laboratory and an institute;
- Implemented the College of Education's annual department head retreat and Five-Year Strategic Planning Events
 - Goal setting, performance review, strategic planning event;
 - Resulted in templates for strategic planning and reporting at the department, college, and university level;
 - Used to inform annual budget hearings with the dean and provost;
- Implemented a College of Education professional development program
 - Tailored professional development Fridays for new and seasoned faculty;
 - Professional development tied to faculty needs and annual evaluation data;
- Engaged in strategic planning for new Fort Worth campus:
 - Participated in planning for P3 funding proposal for two child development centers in Fort Worth;
